Battlefield Plate Has a Commanding View

The Battle of Fort Donelson was fought from February 11 to 16, 1862 near Dover, TN. The Union capture of the fort forced the South to give up southern Kentucky and much of middle and west Tennessee. As a result, the Cumberland and Tennessee Rivers and railroads in the area became vital Federal supply lines. The Union's success also elevated Ulysses S. Grant to the rank of major general and earned him the nickname of "Unconditional Surrender" Grant.
