

Battlefield License Plate Travels to West Tennessee



Reenactor's Daughter Recalls Memorable Trip to Shiloh

This battlefield preservation supporter displayed her personalized license plate at the present day Shiloh United Methodist Church. She purchased the plate in honor of her late father who used to take the family to events at military parks across the United States, Shiloh being one of her fondest memories.

The Battle of Shiloh, fought April 6-7, 1862 in southwest Tennessee resulted in more than 23,000 casualties, outnumbering those inflicted in all of our nation's prior wars combined. It opened the way for Union forces to control vital rail centers in Mississippi and emphatically dispelled hopes for a short and relatively bloodless Civil War.
