The Battle of Lookout Mountain was fought on November 24, 1863. In the rain and fog, Union forces assaulted and captured Lookout Mountain, in what was also known as “the Battle Above the Clouds.” This boost to Union morale allowed three more Union divisions to participate in the successful Battle of Missionary Ridge the next day. With the Confederate army routed, and the siege of Union forces in Chattanooga lifted, the “gateway to the deep South” opened.
